

Three charged in Cyprus baby clinic case

Three people have been charged in connection with the death of three newborn babies last January.

The babies were born at the Ippocraton clinic and were less than 2 weeks old when they became ill.

The outbreak of Legionnaires' disease caused outrage when it was revealed that a total of 11 babies were infected.

A fourth person is also expected to face similar charges relating to flawed health and protection measures at the clinic.

The clinic was shut down after the outbreak and state laboratory tests found high levels of the legionella bacterium in its water supply system and maternity ward.

Since January, Police have been investigating how the outbreak was caused and who may be at fault.
